

## A Message From the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery:

Fall is finally here in Arkansas, and we're hoping it's a good season for our Arkansas Scholarship Lottery retail partners! We've been pretty pumped concerning the news about the uptick in ACT scores for Arkansas high-schoolers since the lottery was established in the state – especially because we're proud that some of the credit for the statewide rise in the test scores is going to the increased availability of the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship to college-bound students.

Students graduating in 2012 from Arkansas high schools had an average score of 20.3 on the 36-point ACT college admissions test – an increase from last year's average of 19.9. The national average composite score is 21.1. Eighty-eight percent, or 26,058 students, of the most recent graduating class in Arkansas took the ACT test at least once. The number of high school students taking the test in Arkansas has increased by more than 15 percent since 2008, and education leaders have cited the expanded opportunities to obtain scholarships due to lottery funds as part of the reason.

The score increase is just another reminder of why we're here – and, as always, the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery couldn't do it without you!


