Pulaski County player wins a \$250,000 Powerball prize

LITTLE ROCK – A player, Christopher Huey from Little Rock is **\$250,000** richer after winning the prize in the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery's **Powerball** game Wednesday, January 20th. Christopher made an extra \$200,000 for spending just \$1 more on the Power Play option. The \$2 Powerball prize for matching 4 white balls and the Powerball is \$50,000, because Christopher spent the extra \$1 and asked for the Power Play option the \$50,000 prize automatically increased to \$250,000, the multiplier for the drawing was 5. Great way to increase the prize! Christopher plans to give a little to his church, pay off some bills and save the rest!

The winner purchased his winning Powerball ticket at EZ Mart 611 on Rainwood Road in Little Rock. For selling the winning ticket, the store is eligible for a \$2,500 retailer bonus.

Powerball® is a multi-state jackpot game. Drawings are held at 9:59 p.m. CT every Wednesday and Saturday. Five numbered balls are drawn from 1 to 69 and one numbered ball is drawn from 1 to 26. If all numbers match

those that are chosen, the player wins the jackpot, which starts at \$40 million and grows until someone wins. If other players also match all six numbers, the prize will be shared in equal amounts. Each Powerball® play is \$2. For an additional dollar, players can add the Power Play® option to multiply non-jackpot winnings by 2, 3, 4, 5 or 10 times.
