## Arkansas Lottery Player Wins \$1,000,000 in Tuesday Night Mega Millions® Draw Jackpot Grows to \$237 Million

A player at the Superstop on Crystal Hill Road in North Little Rock has won a \$1,000,000 Mega Millions prize. The player's identity will not be known until the ticket is presented at one of the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery Claim Centers (Little Rock, Camden, Springdale, Jonesboro). The winner bought a \$1 Mega Millions ticket, matched the five lucky white ball numbers, and purchased the \$1 Megaplier which boosted the win from \$250,000 to \$1 Million. Across America, there were only two other tickets purchased that resulted in a \$1 Million win for this draw.

The Superstop will receive a selling bonus of \$10,000 when the million dollar ticket is cashed.

Also Tuesday night, a player at Satterfield 4 in Conway won a \$10,000 prize in the same drawing, and fifteen Arkansas players in Springdale (2), Uniontown, Little Rock, North Little Rock, Malvern, Morrilton, Heber Springs, Stuttgart, Elm Springs, Marvell, Helena, Charleston, Marion, and Dardanelle won \$600 each.

The \$200 Million Mega Millions Jackpot was not won Tuesday night, so the grand prize increases to \$237 Million for Friday night's drawing. Arkansas began selling Mega Millions tickets on January 31, 2010. In the 15-month history of the Arkansas Lottery, the Mega Millions jackpot has exceeded \$200 Million only three other times—in March (\$200 Million), April (\$252 Million) and June (\$266 Million) of 2010. Mega Millions and Powerball are the two multi-state draw games operated by a consortium of states. Before cross-selling was allowed on January 31, states sold only one of the two games. The two games have similar rules and prizes, and each has drawings twice a week: Mega Millions on Tuesday and Friday nights and Powerball on Wednesday and Saturday nights.

Arkansas has had one multi-state jackpot winner, a Mayflower resident who won a \$25 Million Powerball Jackpot in a drawing January 2, 2010. On Friday night, someone could win almost ten times that amount with the

right Mega Millions numbers.
