Once entered, these tickets accumulate points for free merchandise, from music downloads to flatscreen televisions.

The purpose of the ASL is to provide funding for the General Assembly to appropriate for scholarships and grants to Arkansas residents enrolled in public and private nonprofit two-year and four-year colleges and universities within the state.
